## **The Christmas Season**

Merry Christmas! That's right, Merry Christmas! You might be thinking, "Pastor, Christmas is over," but actually it's not. Christmas is a season and not a day. It's a 12-day season, hence, *The Twelve Days of Christmas*, and ends on January 6 with the Day of Epiphany.

Ironically, Christmas wasn't even celebrated in the early church. For the first 300 years after Jesus' life Christians did not celebrate his birth in any way. But by the 5<sup>th</sup> century it had become common to celebrate Christmas. No one knows when in the calendar year Jesus was born, but there are theories as to why the celebration has settled on December 25.

One theory proposes that such a festival in late December has prehistoric roots in the peoples of the northern hemisphere observing the winter solstice. In the dark of the year, with vegetation dormant and food sources closely monitored, people celebrated with candles, evergreens, and feasting what must have seemed to them a magical restoration of the life of the universe: the return of the sun. (Keeping Time: The Church's Years, 2009, Augsburg Fortress)

Christmas was meant to celebrate the hope people felt as daylight began to lengthen and the darkness of night subsided. Although there may be a couple months of winter remaining there was still the hope of new life in Spring to look forward to. However, over time that focus began to change.

The intensity of the Christmas celebration grew over the centuries. Several times throughout history, church leaders attempted to rein in the cultural excesses: in the colony of Massachusetts from 1659 to 1681, any celebration of Christmas was illegal. In the 19th century, gift-giving, especially to children, became commonplace, especially when St. Nicholas, commemorated on December 6, became associated with Christmas. (*Keeping Time: The Church's Years, 2009, Augsburg Fortress*)

I don't think there is any chance of reining in the gift-giving at Christmas in today's society. It's become commonplace and isn't necessarily a bad thing. Erica recently told me she heard someone share on a podcast something to the effect that a good thing about the consumerism aspect of Christmas is that it encourages generosity. My only encouragement is to extend the celebration from a day to a season. The fact that God is here with us, that Hope has come into the world, is a great reason to turn our celebration from a 1-day event into a 12-day long party! Realizing and recognizing God is stepping in during our darkest hours so that we are not alone is something to truly be cherished and celebrated.




